EXHORTATION

Brothers and sisters: God created us to experience joy in communion with him, to love all humanity, and to live in harmony with all his creation. But sin separates us from God, our neighbors, and creation, so that we do not enjoy the life our Creator intended for us. Also, by our sin we grieve our Father in heaven, who does not desire us to come under his judgment, but to turn to him and live.

As disciples of the Lord Jesus, we are called to struggle against everything that leads us away from the love of God and neighbor. Prayer, fasting, and works of love—the discipline of Lent—help us to wage our spiritual warfare.

I invite you, therefore, to commit yourself to this struggle and confess your sins, asking our Father in heaven for strength to persevere in your Lenten discipline.

CONFESSION

Most holy and merciful Father,

we confess to you and to one another, and to the whole community of saints in heaven and on earth, that we have sinned by our own fault in thought, word, and deed; by what we have done, and by what we have left undone.

We have not loved you with our whole heart, mind, and strength. We have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We have not forgiven others as we have been forgiven.

Have mercy on us, Lord.

We have been deaf to your call to serve as Christ has served us. We have not been true to the mind of Christ. We have grieved your Holy Spirit.

Have mercy on us, Lord.

We confess to you, Lord, all our past unfaithfulness; our pride, hypocrisy, and impatience in our lives.

Have mercy on us, Lord.

Our self-indulgent appetites and ways; our exploitation of other people.

We confess to you, Lord.

Our anger at our own frustration, and our envy of those more fortunate than ourselves.

We confess to you, Lord.

Our intemperate love of worldly goods and comforts, our dishonesty in daily life and work.

We confess to you, Lord.

Our negligence in prayer and worship, and our failure to commend that faith that is in us.

We confess to you, Lord.

Accept our repentance for the wrongs we have done. For our blindness to human need and suffering, and our indifference to injustice and cruelty.

Accept our repentance, Lord.

For all false judgments, for uncharitable thoughts toward our neighbors, and for our prejudice and contempt toward those who differ from us.

Accept our repentance, Lord.

For our wastefulness and pollution of your creation, and for our lack of concern for those who come after us.

Accept our repentance, Lord.

Restore us, good Lord, and let your anger depart from us.

Hear us, Lord, for your mercy is great.

PLEA FOR FORGIVENESS

Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, does not desire the death of sinners, but rather that they may turn from their wickedness and live. Therefore, we implore him to grant us true repentance and his Holy Spirit, that those things which we do on this day may please him, that the rest of our life may be pure and holy, and that at the last, we may come to his eternal joy; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

BLESSING OF ASHES (*Please hold up your individual package of ashes.*) Almighty God, you have created us out of the dust of the earth. May these ashes be a sign of our mortality and penitence, reminding us that only by the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ are we given eternal life; through the same Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. **Amen.**

Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return. In the name of the Father, + and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The small package of ashes you have received may be taken home and used to impose the sign of the cross on your own forehead (or the forehead of someone in your family.) If ashes are imposed on a family member, please say, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return," as you make the sign of the cross.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

Let us pray. Almighty and ever-living God, you hate nothing you have made and you forgive the sins of all who are penitent. Create in us new and honest hearts, so that, truly repenting of our sins, we may obtain from you, the God of all mercy, full pardon and forgiveness; through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. **Amen.**

A Reading from Joel

¹Blow the trumpet in Zion; sound the alarm on my holy mountain! Let all the inhabitants of the land tremble, for the day of the Lord is coming, it is near— ²a day of darkness and gloom, a day of clouds and thick darkness! Like blackness spread upon the mountains a great and powerful army comes; their like has never been from of old, nor will be again after them in ages to come.

¹²Yet even now, says the Lord, return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; ¹³rend your hearts and not your clothing. 

go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you.


⁷"When you are praying, do not heap up empty phrases as the Gentiles do; for they think that they will be heard because of their many words.



February is St. Paul's month to provide volunteers for the Orwigsburg Food Pantry opening. Packers will be needed for Friday evening, February 19, beginning at 6:00 PM. The Penn State Girls' Basketball Team may also provide volunteers for this work, but that is not guaranteed. People who are 18 years old and older and who can lift fairly heavy boxes and place them in cars, will be needed from 9:00 to 11:00 AM on Saturday, February 20. Our Food Pantry is careful to observe masking and distancing guidelines and all the Saturday morning work is outdoors, as this is a drive-by distribution event.

St. Paul's is one of the largest and most generous congregations participating in the Pantry. Please volunteer and support our Food Pantry in this important work.

Introduction to the day: On Ash Wednesday we begin our forty-day journey toward Easter with a day of fasting and repentance. Marking our foreheads with dust, we acknowledge that we die and return to the earth. At the same time, the dust traces the life-giving cross indelibly marked on our foreheads at baptism. While we journey through Lent to return to God, we have already been reconciled to God through Christ. We humbly pray for God to make our hearts clean while we rejoice that "now is the day of salvation." Returning to our baptismal call, we more intentionally bear the fruits of mercy and justice in the world.
