to welcome everyone you send,


and to treasure mercy and demand justice for all people. Amen.

to guide our feet into the way of peace." (Luke 1:68-79)


A Reading from Philippians

and the rough ways made smooth;


⁶and all flesh shall see the salvation of God.""

SERMON



THE NICENE CREED (Read in Unison)


(*The Pastor concludes*): God of new life, you come among us in the places we least expect. Receive these prayers and those of our hearts, in the name of Jesus. **Amen**.




INVITATION TO COMMUNION


