> In early December, the Property Committee oversaw the installation of new exterior lighting on the church, including the ramp access area.

> Council is seeking candidates to fill out its 12-member slate for the coming year. If interested, please contact any Council member, including President Doug Travor, to learn more. Thank you for your earnest consideration given the role's importance to the ongoing life of the church.

> The Property Committee is investigating a **much-needed** new sound system for the sanctuary. The entire project is expected to cost upwards of \$6,000 given the many components (2 lapel microphones, 2 wireless microphones, speakers, amplifier, etc.) involved. It's viewed as a project suitable for several members to underwrite the cost of select components, e.g., fund the cost of an individual microphone or a speaker.
