# **HOLY WEEK & EASTER**

#### SUNDAY SCHOOL

Our Holy Week worship will begin with the 5:30 p.m. worship service on Saturday, April 1 and then at both Palm/Passion services on Sunday, April 2. Join us to hear of our Lord's triumphal entry into Jerusalem as well as the story of his Passion.

Our Maundy Thursday worship will be held on April 6 at 7:00 p.m., as we reflect upon the events of our Lord's Last Supper. The Sharing of Holy Communion and the stripping of the altar are part of this service.

Then we will share a "Stations (or Way) of the Cross" service on Good Friday, April 7 at 7:00 p.m. Our worship will focus on our Lord's passion and death as described in the four Gospels. During this service, Scriptures will be read and hymns will be sung that remind us of the price Jesus paid for the sin of the world.

We will joyously worship together on the Resurrection of Our Lord (Easter Sunday) on April 9 at 8:00 and 10:30 a.m. Our worship will be filled with festive music as we celebrate the most timeless and blessed news, "Christ is Risen. He is Risen indeed."

# EASTER: MORE THAN A DAY!

Easter, which celebrates Jesus Christ's resurrection, is Christianity's most important holiday. It ais a 'moveable feast' because it doesn't fall on a set date every year. Instead, Christian churches in the West celebrate Easter on the first Sunday following the full moon after the spring equinox which was on March 20 this year. Therefore, Easter is observed anywhere between March 21 and April 25.

Easter is really an entire season of the Christian church year, as opposed to a single-day observance. The 50-day period following Easter Sunday is called Eastertide and includes a celebration of Jesus' ascension into heaven. Ascension Day is always on a Thursday, this year it's on May 18.

Eastertide ends with the celebration of the Day of Pentecost. This is celebrated on the seventh Sunday after Easter, commemorating the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles. This year Pentecost falls on May 28.
