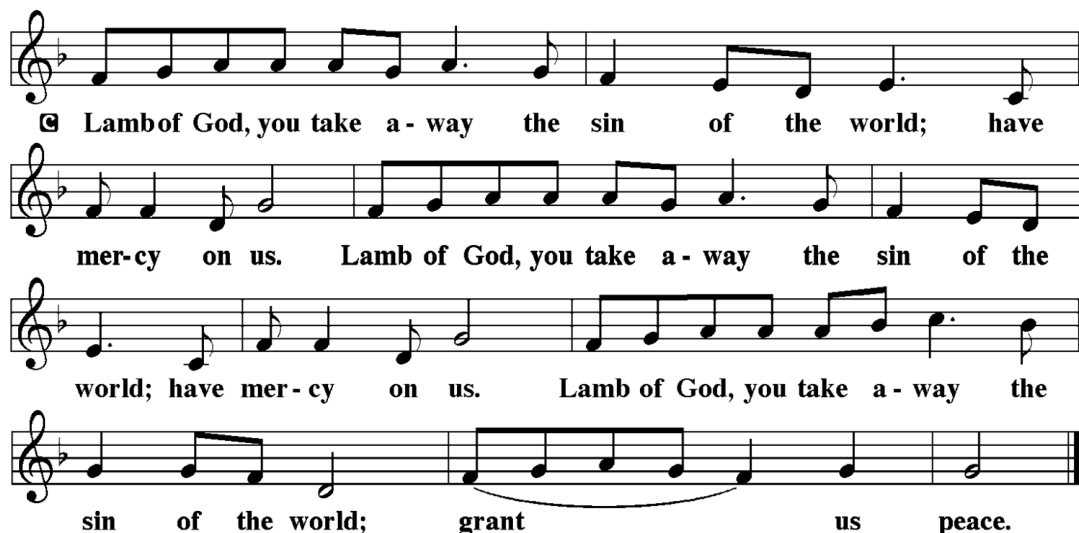
INSTRUCTIONS
