Give up the fear that keeps you silent about your faith. Pray for courage to speak of Christ with humility and hope.

Give up rushing through your days. Slow down enough to notice God's true presence in ordinary moments.

Give up spending so much time on Facebook and social media. Offer some of that time to Scripture and let God's Word shape your days.

Give up ten to fifteen minutes of your daily routine. Set that time apart for prayer, quiet, and listening for the Spirit's voice.

Give up treating your spiritual life as something to squeeze into the margins. Be fully present as you worship, pray, and serve.

Give up judging others by appearance or by the world's standards. Allow God to transform your mind, open your eyes, and reshape your heart.

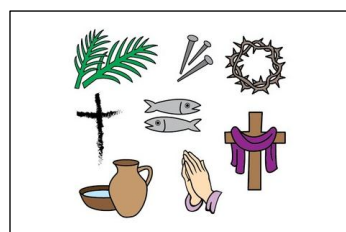
Give up wasting food or resources. Practice good stewardship by living more simply, reusing or repurposing items, and sharing generously.

Working towards Earth Day, let's be Resolute!!
EVERY DROP COUNTS!

Let's face it, none of us can change the world. In this, America's 250th Anniversary, we remember great leaders who stood to protect our natural world, Theodore Roosevelt and Gaylord Nelson, to name just two! But our homes ARE our domain, and we have a LOT to say about the decisions we make...and whether they are the tiny drops of effort that eventually gel into real local change. In a flood, every drop counts, so let's take a look at some of the drops we might be able to handle.

First, as Christians, please remember that any effort you make to provide clean water and clean air is taking care of ALL God's children! Most of the options below have impacts on air and water! Remember that 'convenience' for us is not always the best thing for God's creation. Every week, we have strong prayers in our liturgy, asking God to help us be His hands right

-
- Use cloth grocery bags (=600 plastic bags).
 - Most convenience stores are glad to have you fill up a drink in your own reusable cold/hot cup.
 - Trade your shower poof for a washcloth, scrubbing towel or bamboo scrub brush.
 - Find solid bar shampoos and conditioners, affordable ones can be found!
 - Make your own cleaning products using vinegar, pine and lemon, or find tablet/powder replacements to replace large jugs which are mostly water.
 - Compost your table scraps.
 - Add a few vegetables to your flower garden routine.
 - Vow to replace one invasive plant in your yard with an indigenous one each year.
 - Resolve to 'dead head' in the spring, so that seed heads remain available food for birds and other creatures throughout the winter.

- Research the practicality of solar panels for your particular home.
- Rain barrels collecting roof run-off can water your garden when it's too hot and dry AND reduce the run-off your yard contributes to the streets and waterways.
- If a household item you use still works despite a small crack or dent, opt to keep using it!
- Walk when you can, carpool, combine errands.

This is a small start...please think over what you think you can accomplish and check the little circle next to it. Detach and post in plain view and see how far you can get. This list will also be on the bulletin board in the Gathering Room.

You are encouraged to put a tally mark to the left of items you're working on or already do... and add post it notes to add ideas you've come up with not already here. These are great discussion starters...we can compare notes and share pros and cons!

HOLY WEEK & EASTER

The Lenten season leads us into the story of our Lord’s passion—from his entry into Jerusalem, to the upper room, to the cross, and finally to the joy of the empty tomb. We invite you to join us for worship as we give thanks for Christ’s saving love and celebrate the joy of his Resurrection.

Our Palm/Passion Sunday worship will take place on Saturday, March 28 at 5:30 p.m. and on Sunday, March 29 at 8:00 and 10:30 a.m. Together we will remember Jesus’ joyful entry into Jerusalem and reflect on his suffering and death on the cross.

On Maundy Thursday, April 2, we will gather at 7:00 p.m. to remember Jesus’ command to love one another and the events of the Last Supper. This service includes Holy Communion and the solemn stripping of the altar.

On Good Friday, April 3, we will hold a *Tenebrae* (meaning “darkness” or “shadows”) service at 7:00 p.m. Through readings from the Psalms, we recall the sorrow felt by Jesus’ followers at his betrayal, trial, and crucifixion. The service concludes in darkness and silence, symbolizing our Lord’s burial.

We will celebrate the Resurrection of Our Lord on Easter Sunday, April 5, at 8:00 and 10:30 a.m. With joyful music and the sharing of Holy Communion, we proclaim the good news: *Christ is risen. He is risen indeed.*
